Andrew Langdon and Ann Preston-Jones, authors of several books on Cornish stone crosses, had their pitch just inside St. Hugh's and in full view of our celebrated churchyard cross. Andrew even gave short talks standing alongside his subject. Roger Kingdon, direct descendant of Roger Kingdon, the 15th century lord of Trehunsey, talked about the Kingdon family to groups of visitors. Charlie Moon, descendant of John Rogers of Holwood (whose memorial is on the wall in St. Hugh's) came both days and brought along the Rogers family tree. Other stands in the church, Quethiock Geology, Bottles and other Collectibles relating to Quethiock, Tom Harris Photographer, Metal Detecting finds, together with QPLHG displays, were popular and St. Hugh's cafe was busy. A total in excess of £1,000 was raised for St. Hugh from the sale of refreshments, including the BBQ organised by Joanne Harris. New Vicar

The process of appointing a new vicar is well underway. Members of St. Hugh's PCC have joined with representatives from other PCCs in the cluster to draw up supporting documentation for the vacancy. It is hoped that an appointment will be made in the New Year.

Contactless Card Reader

There is now a contactless card reader at the back of the church. This is able to take donations of any amount. There are clear instructions on the device and on a sheet nearby.

Creation Care

The PCC recently decided to adopt a Creation Care Policy - choosing to Cherish Creation, Cut Carbon, Speak Up and encourage our church community to set Creation Care as part of our way of life. We have registered for the Kernow Green Award which will help St Hugh's to achieve net zero carbon emissions by 2030.

As a diocese, Truro is establishing a network of Creation Care Champions in order to offer support, training etc that will enable churches to respond to the realities of climate change. Sarah Newman has volunteered to be a CCC and lead us on this journey. We have made a start by managing the churchyard for wildlife, with our choice of electricity supplier and moving away from using oasis when flower arranging. We will be looking to see what other changes we can make.
