



FRANK HARE

Second Lieutenant Frank Hare was born in 1892 to Charles and Ellen Hare of Trehunist. His father was listed as a foreman of roads in 1901, but by the census of 1911 had become a farm worker. In 1911, Frank aged 18, was working for a branch of the Kelly family at Trecorme Farm as a waggoner.

By 1914 he was working at the Woodville Bacon Company in Hawkes Bay, New Zealand. He signed up for The New Zealand Expeditionary Force on the 19th December 1914. On the New Zealand Roll of Honour it states that he died of his wounds on Active Service in France on 2nd August 1917 aged 24.

His first cousin Henry Russell Paul, was killed in action on HMS Defence at the Battle of Jutland on 31st May 1916.

Both Frank and Henry were the grandsons of Jane Marks who lived at Furslow Farm and later in Trehunist. A headstone to all their memories stands in St Hugh's Churchyard, Quethiock.
